PALM BEACH COUNTY THOROUGHFARE BEAUTIFICATION GRANT PROGRAM FY 2009 FACT SHEET for State Thoroughfares

The following is intended only to provide a basic overview of this matching grant program in order to evaluate the eligibility of a proposed project, and to assist potential applicants with determining their interest in receiving the complete grant application package for the next grant cycle.

The following information is based on the year FY 2009 application criteria. However, the program criteria are subject to revision each year.

Grant Purpose

The purpose is to assist with the allocation of designated landscape funds to enhance the appearance of state thoroughfares in Palm Beach County and protect and improve the quality of our environment. The enhancement of older, existing landscape projects with additional landscape material will be considered.

Grant Match / Cost Sharing

This grant requires a minimum 50% match by applicant (unless REDI exempt). Please visit http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/BODY_FE426 for information on REDI.

Favorable consideration is given in the evaluation process to applicants providing a match in excess of 50%. The uses of certain in-kind services, including donated materials and labor, may be applied toward applicant's match.

Landscape Maintenance and Litter Control

Applicant must provide (or arrange for another entity to provide) a commitment for the perpetual care of installed landscape projects. In addition, applicant shall become entirely responsible for perpetual litter control of the entire project area.

Eligible Applicants

Potential applicants include, but are not limited to, the following legal entities: municipalities and other government entities. Applicants must be able to enter into grant contractual agreements with the state and must meet requirements regarding insurance, maintenance, etc. **Any entity that has not closed out an outstanding grant that was awarded/allocated by the MPO in 2005 or earlier, including submittal of the required close-out documentation, by the upcoming application due date, shall be ineligible to apply in the application process.** (Applicants that have received previous grant awards for projects that have been abandoned and the grant funds unencumbered are eligible to apply, but the new grant request will be scored slightly lower.)

Eligible Roadways

Matching grants are available for state thoroughfare landscape beautification projects on *designated* Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) right-of-ways. To verify that the proposed project is eligible for grant consideration, contact Elisabeth Hassett, FDOT District IV Landscape Architect by emailing the exact project limits (a dimension from a "known" such as a dimension from an intersection before or after project limits) of the proposed project to Elisabeth.Hassett@dot.state.fl.us.

Application Requirements

Applications must include Conceptual Landscape Design that is FDOT safety criteria compliant prepared by a FDOT pre-qualified Florida Registered Landscape Architect (or a firm's LA of record) experienced in FDOT roadway landscape design and streetscape principals. The Conceptual Design must include a "planting and hardscape" scheme development and preliminary costs. This includes delineation of all proposed landscape improvements: plant materials, tree grates, pavers, accent lighting and areas to be irrigated. Irrigation costs should be provided in a lump-sum basis, but major elements should be itemized and justified. Irrigation plans do not need to be submitted. Any above ground irrigation equipment and points of electrical and water source connections should be included in the costs and shown on the conceptual landscape plans to show feasibility. Water meter connection costs, permit fees and impact fees are not covered under this grant program. Sightlines per Index 546 need to be shown on the conceptual plans. Above ground irrigation equipment and landscape plantings should be kept out of clear sight windows per Index 546.

Role of Keep Palm Beach County Beautiful, Inc., as Grant Program Administrators

Since 1994, the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) has designated Keep Palm Beach County Beautiful, Inc. (KPBCB) as program coordinator to facilitate and administer the grant application process. KPBCB prepares the application packages and solicits, reviews, and recommends projects for grant funding to the MPO. Keep Palm Beach County Beautiful, Inc. (formerly Beautiful Palm Beaches, Inc.), is a 501(c)(3) non-profit, volunteer-based organization, which serves as Palm Beach County's affiliate of Keep America Beautiful, Inc.

Funding Source

Grant awards for this program come from the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the agency responsible for allocation of Florida Dept. of Transportation (FDOT) funding for state transportation projects in Palm Beach County.

*Note: County Commissioners' district discretionary funds and federal funds **can** be used to match state beautification grants.*

Grant Amounts

A total of \$339,000 in grant funds is available for FY 2009 during this RFP release. No maximum grant request applies; however, a \$50,000 minimum grant request (for a project costing \$100,000 or more) does apply for each requested project.

Cost Eligibility (See application instructions for further details).

The following items are eligible for state funding as grant requests and/or matches:

- Vegetation Materials (trees, shrubs, ground cover) and Vegetation Installation - Labor & Planting Materials (mulch, planting backfill, fertilizer, stakes, etc.) combined, must equal or exceed 25% of the all project costs. All other costs below can be applied in any combination (except Design and Post-Design Fees, which are limited to 10%).
- Supportive Irrigation System
- Water by Truck During Installation only when water restrictions prohibit irrigation use (not eligible if an irrigation system exists or is funded by the project)
- Authorized Sidewalk Cuts / Removal to install trees
- Tree Grates, Decorative Paving, and Decorative Lighting
- Removal of Invasive Exotic Plants
- Establishment Period Maintenance (excluding water by truck)
- Design and Post-Design Fees (may not exceed 10% of total project cost). *Note: Design and Post-Design fees typically exceed 10% of total project costs. Post Design includes bidding assistance and site observation visits and reports by the Landscape Architect.*
- Traffic Control (maintenance of traffic during landscape installation)

The following items are **not eligible** as grant requests and/or matches:

- Costs for permits, construction administration (managing contractor, approving contractor’s requisitions for payments, etc.), continuing annual maintenance after the establishment period, litter control, and utility connections and impact fees for irrigation system water and electric.
- Demolition or construction of items such as sidewalks, roadway curbs, fences, walls, fountains, signage, and other hardscape items
- Costs for site preparation, clearing and grubbing, earth moving or fill (to raise grade level)
- Annual flowers.

Grant Program Timeline

- February 2008** – Release of supplemental Request for Proposal (RFP) covering the 2008-09 grant year.
- June 13, 2008** – Completed applications are due to the KPBCB office by 3 p.m.
- July 2008** – Review and evaluation of applications by KPBCB Grants Advisory Committee.
- August 2008** – KPBCB recommendations forwarded to the Metropolitan Planning Organization
- September 2008** – KPBCB notifies approved applicants.

8. Project completed and invoiced by 24 Months from Date of Agreement

Payment of Grant Funds

Grant funds are paid on a reimbursable basis after project installation. A certification of completion by the landscape architect of record must be provided with the request for reimbursement from the granting agency at which time the FDOT DLA/Grant Coordinator will inspect the project to see that the project complies with the intent of the grant and FDOT safety criteria. Upon the successful inspection of the project, the Agency will be notified to submit invoices to FDOT for payment.

Evaluation Criteria

Project applications are evaluated by a panel of KPBCB professionals in the fields of landscape architecture, horticulture, forestry, and roadway / traffic engineering.

Projects are ranked according to an evaluation form included in the application package. Evaluation categories include the following:

- Clarity of Application
- Community Values
- Community Support
- Environmental Value
- Cost Sharing
- Visibility
- Design Quality
